A Word from the Coordinator

My second year as coordinator of CATHII began with the fortunate discovery of the Talitha Kum Network, the International Network of religious sisters who are activists against human trafficking. From September 21 to 27, 2019, as a joint delegate with Claudette Desmarais, ss.cc.j.m., we participated in the Network's General Assembly in Rome. During the meeting, which brought together 86 delegates from all continents, Sister Nicole Rivard was one of ten nuns recognized for her commitment to fighting human trafficking. We continued our trip in Geneva to meet with Franciscans International, one of CATHII's major partners. Accredited by the United Nations, Franciscans International introduced us to the UN's Special Rapporteur on trafficking in persons team to present a few significant facts about the human trafficking situation in Canada.

The pandemic disrupted a part of our calendar, leading the Board of Directors to seek alternate ways to build connections within the CATHII and with those with whom we stand:

This Year's Highlights

Current Events/Advocacy Committee

- A letter was sent to Minister Bill Blair (Public Safety, Government of Canada) and Minister Maryam Monsef (Women and Gender Equality) to request details about the use of the \$75 million promised in the National Strategy to Combat Human Trafficking 2019-2024.
- Having noted the partial closure of the Canadian Human Trafficking Hotline, the CATHII sent a letter to the four ministers involved (including the Prime Minister of Canada) to call for its full reopening. A thank you letter was also sent in June 2020, following the full reopening of the Canadian Human Trafficking Hotline.
- A SPECIAL REPORT ON COVID-19 and human trafficking was prepared, in the form of two documents that present the effects and initiatives, within and outside Québec (Canada and the world).

The Financial Sustainability

CATHII's Financial Sustainability Committee was formed November 22 during our 2019 General Annual Meeting. In winter 2020, the committee was busy detailing the steps for applying for a charity number to Canada Revenue Agency. It also gathered advice from a partner organization. The committee's work has gotten off to a good start.

The Students Committee for UN conference

This project is designed to invite university students to receive training with CATHII to prepare to participate in a United Nations (UN) session.



Since the pandemic, France Laforge, Élodie Ekobena, Lise Gagnon, s.n.j.m., have reworked the project and on April 7 met with Jill Hanley, a professor at McGill University who has long been involved in the CATHII. Jill Hanley agreed to support this project as an associate professor. With COVID-19... which shows no signs of slowing... and which managed to slow us down, Jill suggested seeing whether the UN sessions could be followed by Zoom, since students are now used to this new approach.

Collaborations and partnerships

Franciscans International and the Special Rapporteur on trafficking in persons team

With the support of the Franciscans International, France Laforge and Claudette Desmarais, sscc.j.m., met with a member of the UN's Special Rapporteur on trafficking in persons team to share facts and specifics about human trafficking in

Canada.



La Commission des droits de la personne et des droits de la jeunesse (CDJDP)

With the contribution of Nancy Roberge, the CATHII coordinated developing a podcast on human trafficking, in cooperation with organizations that work directly with women who suffer sexual exploitation and with the CDJDP.

The Canadian Council for Refugees (CCR)

On November 27, 2019, the coordinator of the CATHII attended the National Forum on Human Trafficking organized by the CCR, the Fall Consultation, and two webinars about people who are more vulnerable during the pandemic.

A priority: maintaining the Coalition québécoise contre la traite des personnes

After a five-month work stoppage because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the coordinator of the Coalition québécoise contre la traite des personnes (CQCTP) has been back since August 17. With the help of the coordination committee, the coordinator immediately picked up where he left off in March, i.e., constituting the CQCTP as a non-profit corporation. It is a priority designed to sustain the Coalition and, in turn, the coordination position necessary to ensure the proper functioning of the CQCTP.

We hope that the transformation of the CQCTP into a non-profit organization will help with financing and full recognition with government authorities.

In terms of work, our priority objective is to do everything we can to ensure the sustainability of the CQCTP.
